Construction Begins On WaterOne Ozone Facilities



WaterOne kicked off construction on its new Ozone Water Treatment Facilities at a groundbreaking ceremony on Friday, December 15th. The new facility, pipeline and equipment will be located at WaterOne's Hansen Treatment Plant. The project was bid at \$35.8 million and is anticipated to be complete by the summer of 2020.

"There's been a lot of advancements and improvements at WaterOne over the years, and I see this Ozone project as another step forward in our evolution," said General Manager Mike Armstrong. "It's taken a while to get to this point, but I think that when we look back on this down the road, people will say that taking on this project was a very innovative decision."

Ozone is a powerful natural disinfectant and will offer more effective treatment for bacteria, viruses, pharmaceuticals, and taste and odor compounds in the source water. Integrating ozone into the water treatment process will make WaterOne's operations more efficient by eliminating, reducing, or simplifying water treatment chemicals and processes.

Special thanks were given to outgoing Director of Production Tom Schrempp, who retired in January.

"This is an organization that has always been open to looking at new things like ozone and keeping up with industry standards," Tom said. "It's been exciting to see it come together and it's been great to be a part of it." ♦

This year's event features a new competitive 1-mile run for kids ages 5 to 12, and children 5 and younger can participate for free in a Fun Run.

Tom Schrempp Retires, Michelle Wirth Promoted To Director of Production

Tom Schrempp, WaterOne's Director of Production, was honored at his retirement celebration in January for his 26 years of service.

Tom's career was marked by substantial growth in WaterOne's service area, with the District's total water capacity doubling over the course of his leadership. During his career, Tom oversaw the construction of numerous facilities and expansions, including the award-winning Wolcott Treatment Plant which is the largest Pall Membrane treatment facility in the United States. Tom has been an active member of the American Water Works Association (AWWA) for 34 years and served on the Board of Directors. He authored multiple papers, presented at state and national conferences, and also served in leadership roles in the Kansas section of the AWWA. Tom served on several project advisory committees for the Water Research Foundation as well.

In 2011, Tom received the George Fuller Award for his distinguished service, sound engineering skill, constructive leadership, and diplomatic talent. Tom was diligent in achieving the Director's Award for the Partnership for Safe Drinking Water, which gained recognition for WaterOne's commitment to superior water quality and improved treatment processes. Under Tom's leadership, WaterOne was awarded the Best Tasting Water in Kansas award the most number of times of any water provider. Tom Schrempp closed his career with the groundbreaking of a state-of-the-art Ozone Water Treatment facility in December 2017, which is expected to be complete in 2020.

Michelle has 18 years of experience dedicated to utility engineering and management, and prior to WaterOne had served as the Environmental Services Manager with the City of Olathe. Michelle holds a Master of Science in Engineering Management from the University of Kansas and a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from North Dakota State University. She is a registered Professional Engineer in Kansas and Missouri. 💧

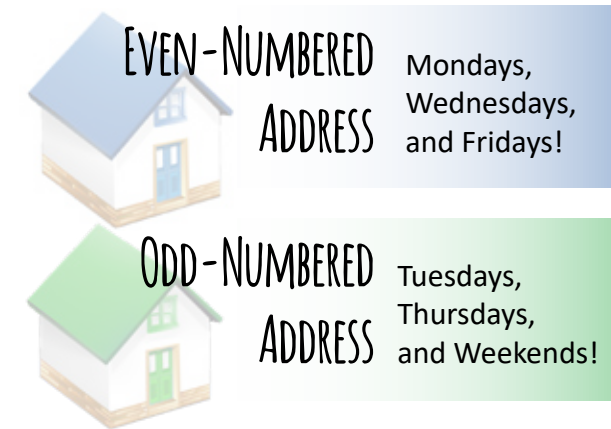
Spring is here! Don't Forget To Check Your Sprinklers

WaterOne Judged “Best Tasting Water In Kansas” at KRWA Conference

Recently, judges at a regional water conference confirmed what Johnson County residents already know- that WaterOne’s water is some of the most delicious tap water around.

The Kansas Rural Water Association named WaterOne “Best Tasting Water in Kansas- 2018” at its annual conference in Wichita, KS. The contest presents judges with samples of water from dozens of utilities. Glasses of the unlabeled water samples are served at room temperature for the most accurate comparison, since ice or chilled temperatures can alter flavor perceptions. Judges are instructed to “sniff, sip, slurp, swish, and swallow,” which gives them a broad sense of each sample’s flavor properties, aroma, and mouth feel. The samples are then rated based on these aesthetic preferences.

For Michelle Wirth, WaterOne’s Director of Production, the award is a reflection



of the hard work that goes into making great tasting tap water for WaterOne’s customers every day of the year.

“There really is an art to water treatment, from our source waters in the Kansas and Missouri Rivers all the way to our customers’ homes,” said Michelle. “This award confirms that our extensive, multi-tiered treatment process produces water that is clean, safe, and tastes delicious!” 💧
